Gallery Walk Review

The different blends of color, the various images portrayed, and the glorious atmosphere perfectly displays my visit to Lowell's personal Gallery Walk. About 21 people came and they seemed to be perfectly satisfied with the art. The blend of analogous colors caught my attention because those artists were clever enough to manipulate the hues and shadows through those related colors. The background in which holds the primary object seem realistic and tried to portray height, depth, and distance through contrasting shades and barely visible colors. Each one utilized an unique technique such as cross-hatching, horizontal coloring, vertical coloring, and even curved coloring. The excitement was just rising up for the climax was reached when I perceived the different sketchbook assignments. Those pictures resembled nature and common aspects that everyone takes for granted. Typical scenery was transformed into a beautiful world where imagination took a huge step forward. Three drawings that surely captured my attention were "The Chase", "Moon Goddess", and "PK-Ah-Choose" because they were very bright and colorful. "The Chase" represented an average baseball field that has an eagle in the middle of the field. The eagle probably represents freedom and the courage to live in a society of isolation. The "Moon Goddess" has a picture of a woman shining radiantly under the golden moon. The moon represents exuberance and energy that is needed upon every person despite their unwillingness to express it. The "PK-Ah-Choose" has an animated image of Pikachu and that represents how reality parallels with animation world. Both worlds reveal highly amount of flaws and irrationality but both succeeds in striving to reach a similar goal and ambition. Thus, this Gallery Walk was a pleasant experience that I will surely not forget.

Entertaining critique!

In this art exhibition, two pieces really stand out. ^{+ Joe Amato}
First, an analogous color project: two side by side colored pencil explorations, one in the others opposite analogous colors. A 14/15 ART
head of cabbage juxtaposes itself next to a cabbage moth. 2
The cabbage dabbled with yellow and green while the moth is damasked blue and red to produce calm, sterile, almost antic lilac. The moth is nicely executed and the artist clearly made use of good technique, rendering very realistic portrayals of the respective subjects.

The second notable piece is a clown in pastel. There is a kind of lazy quality to the pastel giving it a dreamlike, surreal impression. The clown's very visage is utterly haunting while, on closer inspection, the ideas of degeneracy and sadism may be sensed. In youthful words, this composition is best described as creepy. The whole image of the clown started from an one-inch strip of magazine picturing the middle portion of a made-up woman's face.

All the pieces are descriptive, narrative, and alive.
It is a wonderfully entertaining show.

The Art Show consisted of many different, original, and outstanding pieces of artwork. None of them were similar to the other, they all had a unique factor about them (whether it'll be technique or composition) that set them apart from one another.

Here are some pieces in particular:

- "Trapped" by Seth Grassene

This work is interesting to me because of its concept and story it tells. It features a woman trapped in a box, with a statue of a man facing her way, all of them being in a garden. The contents of the work just fits so well with each other, with the man "wondering" about the woman.

- "Crazy" by Joan Gallego

This work is interesting to me because of its composition, the media used, and the title. It features water color splashed with rough, fireworks-like streaks, making it go well with its title "crazy". The colors used were lively also.

- Red Apple + Green Apple iPod: Unknown Title + Artist

This work is interesting to me because of its composition, analogous color, and realism. It features a realistically drawn apple and iPod, contrasting in color. The edges are crisp and sharp, the lighting/shadowing is detailed, and the strokes are smooth and fluent.
